

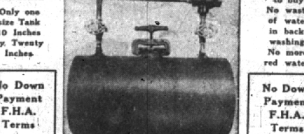
Torch Drive Ends At High School

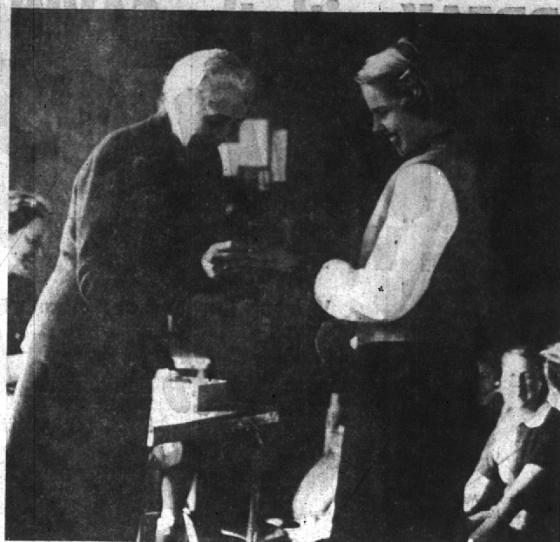

Troy High school students voted for the man rather than the party when they went to the polls in a mock election last week.

Student ballots gave Republican Eisenhower 167 votes to 286 for Democrat Stevenson for the presidency and gave Senator Blair Moody the nod over Republican Potter for the senate seat by 246 to 289.

They changed course on Congressional Representative George A. Dondero and gave him the nod over Democrat John Law, 333-330. Again they reversed their field by selecting Democrat Governor G. Mennen Williams over Republican Fred M. Alger by 373 to 309.
