**Unusual Photos Will Be Shown B'ham Rotarians**

Photographic slides taken of places throughout the world not ordinarily seen by tourists or visitors will be shown by L. L. Col. Walter H. Channing to the Birmingham Rotary club Monday noon. Col. Channing, a native of Detroit, has been associated with the Crowley, Miner company since 1922 with the exception of five years in military service. He is merchandise manager of boys' and men's wear, linens and domestics. Entering the army in 1942, he was connected first with the Post Exchange office with the rank of major. He served with the 5th Army Command (later the 5th Army) at Fort Curtis and Chicago.

**Voters to Hold Dress Rehearsal Week of Oct. 27**

Through the cooperation of city officials and the Birmingham League of Women Voters, a voting machine training program will be conducted here the week of Oct. 27. City Clerk Irene E. Hanley said that inasmuch as the final registration in Birmingham will be about 13,000 there appears to be a real need to give as many as possible a chance to become familiar with machine voting. "Special attention needs to be given to the fact that the presidential ballot is not included in the 'straight voting', and must be voted by moving an additional lever," she said. The League is sponsoring the program by placing one machine in the window at Himehollow's for one week, beginning Oct. 27. A group of members will receive special training from Miss Hanley in order that they may properly instruct the public.

MISS HANLEY said additional machines would be placed in the high school lobby at the right of the main entrance, in the GTR station, Wesley drug store at 14 Mile and Pierce, and the basement of the city hall.

"Through the cooperation of the League, the two major political parties and others, I believe that these additional machines can be staffed each evening by volunteers," Miss Hanley said. "If it is not possible to provide these trained instructors during the day-time, at least the machines will be available for interested persons. Each machine will be unlocked and in working order for persons to practice on, and instructions will be posted near all of them."

Miss Hanley said that, in addition to the machines, sample ballots can be made available at the various demonstration booths to supplement the instruction and practice. **Ping Pong Team In First Practice.** Adults interested in the proposed Birmingham YMCA ping pong team, which will play in the Oakland County league at Pontiac, are urged to attend the first practice session at the Y House, 400 East Lincoln, on Thursday, October 23, 7:30 p.m. Players are urged to wear gym shoes and bring their own paddles.
