

Villa Rezoning Approved By City

Birmingham city commissioners Monday night approved an amendment to the zoning ordinance to change the south side of Villa from single residences to income bungalow, and lot 120 Birmingham Gardens subdivided from business A to multiple residence.

Before passing on the rezoning, Commissioner Y. B. Watkins commented that some residents in the area were opposed to the architecture of the terraces abutting the property and complained that the property was not being kept up.

A Prudential Investment company representative, developer of the property, promised that shrubs would be placed in front of the terraces soon.

Commission Tables Lincoln Well Walk

Suggested construction of sidewalk in front of the Lincoln well property to be included in the Lincoln sidewalk project was tabled indefinitely by city commissioners Monday night.

In discussing the portions of Lincoln to be serviced by sidewalks at last week's meeting, commissioners directed City Manager Donald C. Egbert to study the possibility of having the sidewalk along the 700 foot wide city property on the south side of the street.

Mayor Dean B. Beier commented that the sidewalk would serve too few people for the expenditure of the \$1,150 cost of the work.

Other commissioners agreed with the mayor and the matter was dropped for the time being.

AAB Women Honor Outstanding Record

One of banking's highest honors was won this year by Mrs. L. Lorraine (Cecil) Attig, 238 North Bates, associated with the loan and discount department of the Birmingham National bank.

Mrs. Attig received the Jean Arnot Reid award in Atlantic City last weekend at the conclusion of the annual conference held there by members of the American Association of Bank Women.

The Reid award is made each year to the woman graduate of the American Institute of Banking, who is selected as best fitted on the basis of character and efficiency to represent women in banking.

Public Invited To See Giffels' Z-Shaped Room

One of the most unusual features ever incorporated in a residence will be opened to public view Sunday afternoon, Oct. 5, at the new home of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond F. Giffels, 929 Glenary Road, Bloomfield Village, under the sponsorship of the Susan Trowbridge guild of the First Presbyterian church.

The house will be open from 2 to 5 p.m. Proceeds will go to the building fund of the church, construction of which is underway and scheduled for completion early next year.

THE FEATURE of the house regarded by architects as an outstanding advancement in efforts to meet modern day living problems, is the "kitchen living room" designed for comfortable living as well as entertaining in a servantless era.

The room is "Z-shaped," one rectangle of which can be shut off from the balance by sliding panels. When panels are open, the living part of the room becomes a part of a completely equipped kitchen which includes a fireplace for heating as well as cooking.

Floors of the entire space are covered with plastic treated cork. Walls and ceilings, as well as all doors and woodwork, are white pine.

ONE ENTIRE SIDE of the space is open to an attractive stone terrace and wooded hillside. A stainless steel refrigerator two or three times the size of the largest standard household unit. About half of the refrigerator is for freezer storage.

New Kresge Store Work Starts Soon

Construction of the new S. S. Kresge company store at Henrietta and Maple will begin the first of the year, according to a company spokesman. Razing of the First Methodist church, which has occupied the corner for 73 years, will begin within 10 days.
