

**Apple Fritters**  
 3 small apples cored and peeled  
 1 cup sugar  
 Juice of 1 lemon  
 1/2 teaspoon grated nutmeg

Cut the apples in small pieces, sprinkle with the sugar, the lemon juice and the nutmeg. Let the apples stand for 1/2 hour. Dip in fritter batter and fry in deep hot fat. Make a jelly from the apple peelings and pour over the fritters.
