Michigan Prisons Topic Of Rotary Club Speaker

DeHull Travis, Birmingham attorney, spoke at the Monday luncheon meeting of the Birmingham Rotary club on "The Man Without A Smile", drawing on his experience on the Michigan board of pardons.

He outlined the three reasons for imprisonment: restraint for the protection of society, punishment and reform. The latter, Travis stressed, should be the aim of all law enforcement and prison officials.

Travis discussed conditions in Michigan prisons from his 1911 appointment by the late ex-Gov. Osborn through to modern penal institutions.

He said enforcement agencies are trying to curb crime by making it more and more hazardous and honest living more profitable. He praised the modern trend of "Overcoming evil with good" in place of the former "eye for an eye" system of cruelty and harshness for prisoners.




