

## Will Participate In Baptist Plans For Conference

The First Baptist church of Birmingham has planned participation in the extensive missionary conference, Oct. 26-Nov. 9, with several guest speakers appearing here.

Throughout the Metropolitan Detroit area, some 25 missionaries are scheduled to speak. These men and women are serving the church in all parts of the world.

The first local speaker will be heard Sunday, Oct. 26, when Earl Robertson will address the Youth Fellowship at a 4 p. m. meeting. He will tell of his many years of service among the Navajo Indians in Colorado. The meeting is open to the public.

ON OCT. 28, at 8 p. m., members of the local church are asked to take part in a Missionary mass meeting in the Convent Baptist church, Detroit. The Rev. Emil Kontz, who is acting as chairman of this gathering, said 25 missionary workers would attend. An open house and exhibition will be held during the afternoon.

The mid-week meeting of the local church, Wednesday, will hear a talk by Thorbjorn Olsen of San Francisco, who has conducted a Seaman's Mission on the west coast. His talk will follow the fellowship supper set for 7 p. m.

Mr. Kontz has scheduled several other speakers for the Birmingham church, including the Rev. C. L. Kau of India; Miss Thomasine Allen, Japan; Dr. William A. Petzold, Montana; and Leonard Crain, working in Burma.
