Mr. and Mrs. Charles Thieson have moved into their new home at 18581 Bungalow. They are from Detroit where Mr. Thieson is in the insurance business.

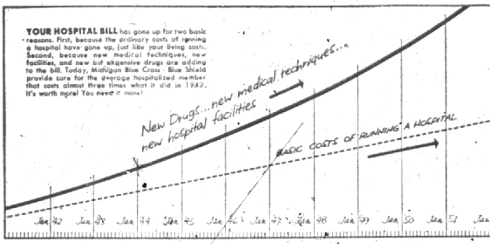
The Board of Executives of The Woman's Association will meet in the lounge at the Towante Community Church at 1 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 5.

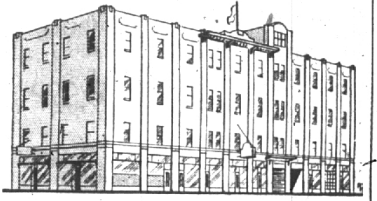

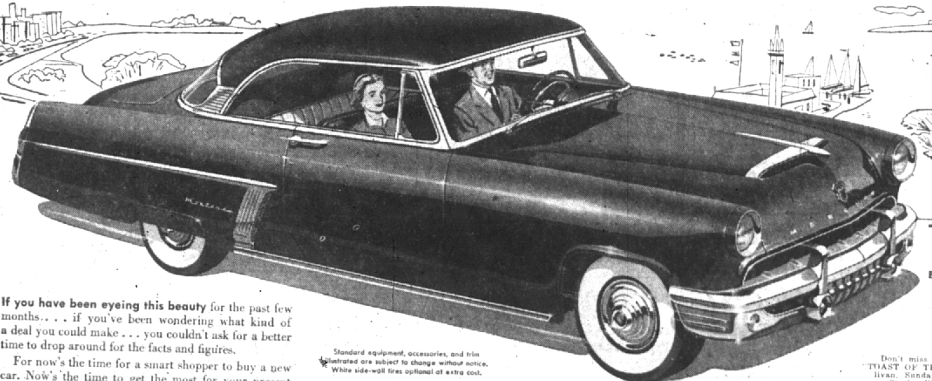
