Down to Earth

The organic gardeners in Birmingham realize as they watch the wholesale burning of leaves. The leaves of one tree are worth dollars to the gardener when it is turned into organic matter in the Spring.

Many people say municipalities to unload leaves on their property to be placed in large piles to decompose. Before the Fall season, discarded broken sidewalk can be made into a walled-in area to assure the pile from blowing away. Chicken wire secured by sticks driven into the soil is another way of controlling a pile of leaves during the winter.

THE NEXT STEP is to take a few shovelfuls of soil of any texture to introduce the bacteria as you would yeast to a bread mixture. There are commercial powders on the market to increase the decomposition. Then, water down the pile with water. To conserve your resources on your own property this manner will give you a satisfying feeling of good home management. The same folks who burn their leaves to the Fall are the same ones who run around in circles in the Spring looking for black dirt which has to be laboriously wheeled to its final destination.

About the last of November, on a day when there isn't snow on the ground, is the best time to apply meliorant to the lawn to feed the grass roots. This type of fertilizer is a sewage byproduct and is high in nitrogen. By applying this fertilizer at this time your grass will benefit, every time the temperature is above forty during the early Spring months.

THIS IS THE time to force Spring flowering shrubs, Crocuses, grape hyacinths, daffodils, daisies, and Darwin tulips lend themselves to this special technique.

Place the bulbs in flower pots with about one inch of soil above the top of the bulbs. You are planting tulips be sure and have the flat side of the bulb toward the side of the pot to assure a pleasing leaf development. Your commercial growers have found that bulbs placed in the pot in this manner assure them of the high dollar for their product.

In your yard dig a trench 18" x 24" deep and wide enough to accommodate the pots. At this time place a sturdy stick at each end of the trench so the boundaries will show above a snow bank for midwinter retrieving. Now, for the first time, introduce water to the pots and drench well. Over the top of the pots replace the ground level with a collection of loose leaves, sticks, and end up with a piece of burlap if you have some available. If you replaced the trench level with the soil you have removed to make it, you would need a regular to enter during the winter.

Licenses Delayed In Troy Township By Court Order

Over 250 persons crammed the Troy township hall Monday night, October 20, to protest the granting of two tavern licenses.

Township board members, faced with a restraining order from the Oakland County Circuit Court, preventing them from issuing the two licenses applied for, decided to table the matter until the court action is completed.

Oliver N. and Margaret P. Crooks, applicants for a tavern license in the township, gained the restraining order in the belief that their petition should be considered before action was taken on any other requests.

The court order did not reach township officials until the afternoon of the meeting night.

THE HEARING was called to decide on the applications of Milton H. Berry, 1323 West Maple and Edward J. Armstrong, 4880 Rochester road.

Many Birmingham people were present to oppose the granting of a license to the Berry airport. Members of the Pembroke Manor subdivision contended that the addition of a liquor license at the airport "would only add to the nuisance that already exists."

Berry told township officials that he holds an approval from the Civil Aeronautics Association to operate a restaurant at the air field.

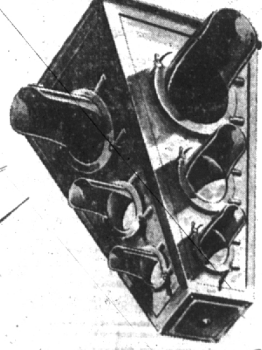
