Safer Fence Need Cited by Couple

Mr. and Mrs. John F. Caultley, 2795 Manchester, have asked Birmingham city commissioners to insert a clause into the city's fencing ordinance, prohibiting persons from erecting cyclone fences with the barbed edge pointing up.

The Caultleys pointed out that such a ruling is now in effect in several neighboring communities and feel that it is a safety measure which should be considered here.

Commissioners asked City Manager Donald C. Egbert to check over the present ordinance regarding the installation of fences to see what future action could be taken. It was brought out that they could not require persons whose fences had already been erected to change them.

Voting Machine Loan Denied by Commission

The request of Kingswood school for the use of a Birmingham voting machine to use in a mock election Oct. 28 was turned down by city commissioners Monday night.

Miss Nancy C. Wolfner of the Kingswood history department was told that because the state was only seven years before the national elections, commissioners did not feel it advisable to let a machine leave the city. They pointed out that should anything happen to the machine, Birmingham voting would be snarled.

It was suggested that the Kingswood girls could come to Birmingham and use one of the machines here.

City Employees Offered Polio Insurance Plan

The benefits of polio insurance is being offered Birmingham city employees on a share-the-cost basis, the city assuming 25 per cent of the policy cost.

In his recommendation, City Manager Donald C. Egbert said the premium on a \$5,000 policy would be \$5.50 per year per family, or \$1.50 for an individual policy.
