Migrant Workers Help Detroit Tells Baptist Union

At the Oct. 2 meeting of the Mission Union of the First Baptist church, Mrs. Franklin Heppburn, of the Detroit Board of Foreign Missions spoke on "Migrant People—Not Problems."
 "She stressed the part these people play in our daily lives by noting that most of the fruit in industry is dependent on migrant workers for their harvest. In Michigan these people work also, in the sugar beet fields, between 20,000 and 30,000 of them working in this state each year.
 Mrs. Heppburn, who has been working for the betterment of migrant families since 1921, said that Michigan had done less for them than any state in the union.
 The hostesses of the day were Mrs. Duncan Hudson, Mrs. Stewart Smith and Mrs. John Akers.
 Mrs. John Burket presented the report on work done in white cross during the year. The devotions were led by Mrs. Daniel Wells.

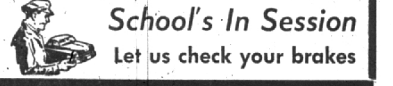
