Air Cadet Killed As Training Plane Crashes in Texas

Air Cadet Robert L. Beaubien, 23, son of Mrs. and Mrs. Robert L. Beaubien, 5095 West Maple, Franklin, Mich., was killed Tuesday when a training plane crashed and burned while on a routine flight at Goodfield Air Base, San Angelo, Tex.

The cadet was flying with Cleland F. Card, 23, of Minneapolis who was also killed. Two sisters said both were due to finish the first phase of basic training within a week.

Cadet Beaubien was born in Ferndale and had been in the Air Force for about 10 months. He attended St. Frederick's school in Pontiac and St. Hugo of the Hills school in Detroit.

The body will be brought to Birmingham for services and burial, details of which are not yet completed.
