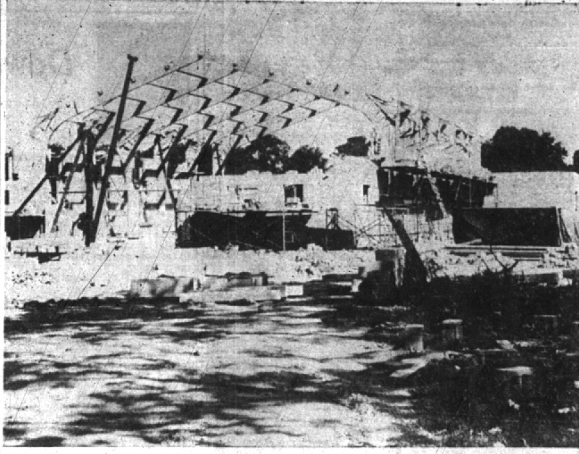


SUNDAY SERMON TOPICS

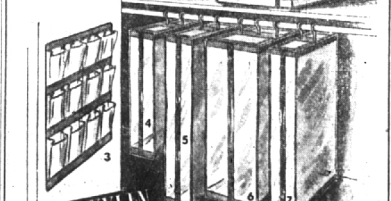
Mr. Felter has been in the field since 1915 and served as pastor in several eastern churches over a period of 31 years.
