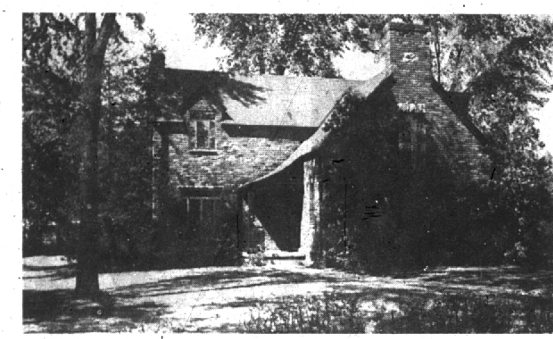

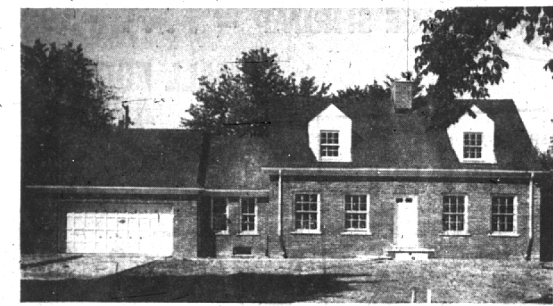

Around the House

It is possible to have variety in the floors of your home. Variety for variety's sake would be a novelty, but a wide choice of floor covers enables you to choose the type best suited to your needs.

Cork tile is ideal for a bedroom or nursery because of its sound absorption qualities. The colors are rich, subdued tones and the tile has high insulating properties. It is not ideal where traffic is very heavy and should not be used over a concrete slab directly on the ground. All things considered, it is well worth its moderately high cost.

Plastic tile is tough enough to outwear other resilient floorings. It is priced in proportion to its strength. It is not harmed by grease, oil, alkaline moisture or mild acid solutions. It resists dents and can be installed over anything, anywhere.

ASPHALT TILE is the least expensive of the resilient tiles. It will take heavy traffic in its stride. Dampness will not damage or loosen it, and for this reason is a good choice for basement recreation rooms. If it is to be used in the kitchen, be sure to get the grease-resistant grade.

Rubber tile is carpet-soft and resilient. The surface is smooth and easy to clean. Its quietness, underfoot and durability justify its extra expense.

Linoleum is the most popular type of non-wood flooring. In the best quality linoleum the design goes all the way through to assure long wear. It resists dirt and dust and welcomes hard wear.

INLAID LINOLEUM can be cemented down over smooth wood-floors or concrete surfaces not in contact with the ground.

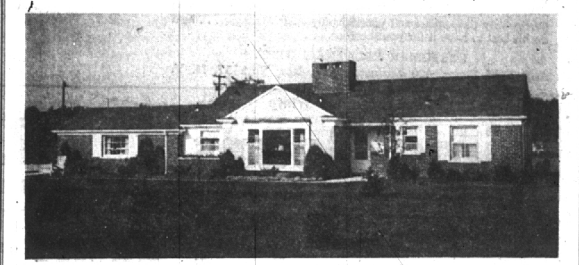
Terrazzo and cement floors are practically indestructible. They are very handsome and can cover your livingroom floor and extend right out onto the uncovered terrace. Terrazzo is easy to maintain. Concrete floors can do the same job and can be made attractive if they are colored during installation. They should be sealed and protected by wax to keep out dirt.

Clay tile is proof against any type of dirt or hard wear. It is good inside as well as outside. The floors cost more, but will outlast any resilient or wood floor.

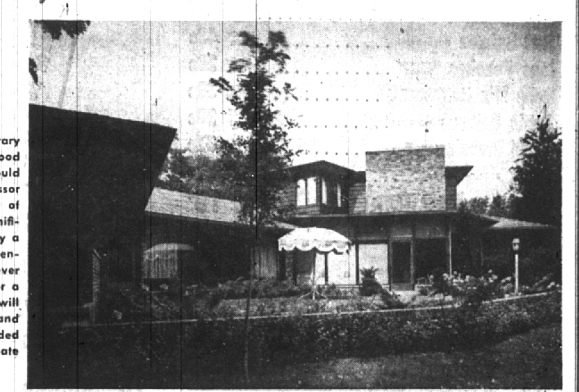
