### East Maple Development Is Started

Out of destruction will come construction.

The Barton shopping center soon to be developed on the north side of Maple between Hunter and Poppleton, will get its start as soon as the four old homes in the block are torn down.

The first unit of the center to be built will be the building to house a Kroger super market. Work on this building is expected to be started as soon as the property is cleared and graded.

The 120 foot by 140 foot store will be one of the largest grocery stores in the area, according to Charles Smith, Kroger real estate representative.

"BY PLACING employee rooms, offices and rest rooms on a balcony, we can devote the entire floor area to selling space," Smith said.

The company hopes to have its opening in April.

Carl O. Barton, developer of the property, said that plans are progressing for the remainder of the stores on the 690-foot East Maple frontage.

City planners and commissioners still are studying the feasibility of rezoning the northern strip of the property from residence to parking to insure more adequate off-street parking facilities for the center.

Architects for the buildings are O'Dell, Hewitt and Luckenbach, of Birmingham.
