

Car Accidents Show Decrease; Deaths Lower

There were 149 traffic deaths in Michigan during July, 21 less than the 170 persons killed in the same month last year, but 17 more than the July average of 132 for the five-year period of 1946 to 1950.

According to the State Police monthly statistical report, injury and accident figures also were below July of last year. There were 4,317 persons injured, a decrease of 485, or ten per cent, under 4,802 and accidents totaled 15,559, a decrease of 1,023, or eight per cent, under 16,582.

Michigan's traffic record for the first seven months of this year includes 877 deaths, 25,974 injuries and 89,794 accidents. Compared to the same period last year, deaths decreased three, or three-tenths of one per cent, under 880.

INJURIES DECREASED 989, or four per cent, under 26,957 and accidents decreased 9,151, or nine per cent, under 98,945.

Available traffic data indicate a leveling off of the upward trend in motor vehicle mileage which has prevailed since 1945.

Travel for the first six months of 1952, the latest figure available, was down a little less than one per cent, or 11.4 billion miles as compared with 11.5 billion miles for the same period in 1951. The death rate of 6.39 per 100 million miles of travel was up four per cent over 6.15.

Total mileage for the entire year of 1951 was nearly 25 and one-half billion, an all time high. The death rate was 6.98, an all time low.


