A strange but understandable malady strikes at a couple of hundred thousand men in Michigan each year at this time. They wonder about in somewhat of a daze, preoccupied by lofty thoughts transcending the petty problems of everyday life.

If one could penetrate the haze which surrounds these victims, visions of lovely streams on a warm spring day would come to life. The dimpled surface of the quiet pool would mark the cautious rise of a feeding trout, and the dream would watch an angler's perfect cast drop a tantalizing fly in just the right spot.

You see there's nothing fundamentally wrong with these absent-minded males. It's just that "I" Day is coming, and stands for "I" Day. "I" Day this year falls on April 25th, the official opening of the 1953 season.

Hatcheries Busy

Again this year Michigan fish hatcheries will plant about a quarter of a million legal-sized trout in readily accessible streams before the season opens. Again this year fishermen will stream to that stream opening fly to catch a large percentage of those gallant, sensitive, sleek rainbow and brook members of the trout family.

In several basins not too easily reached, and there are many, many miles of fine trout waters rarely fished in Michigan. If you have not already planned your trip for the opening week end, consider a new adventure this year—a search for the fair of those big, native trout high up in the headwaters of Michigan. You'll find far up an old abandoned logging road, impassable to cars.

Forget the modern theory that one should stop from an automobile parked at the edge of a stream. Fish a few hundred yards, then drive on to another riverside parking spot. Get off the beaten path. WALK and make your trout approaching that likely looking pool deep in a swamp with caution. Wild trout are wise trout. Big and fat because they're always alert to danger.

"One for the Book"

Success in adventure like this is never forgotten. It is a true triumph for the sportsman's memory book for a single grand-daddy trout taken from a fast secret pool as north a creek-full of hatchery-raised fish, anytime? Maybe that "grand-daddy" won the battle and is still in the pool, and you come home empty-handed. There's still a hope of trying again. By "covery" will keep. There's another day of reckoning with that old tackle-rustler soon in Michigan Outdoors.
