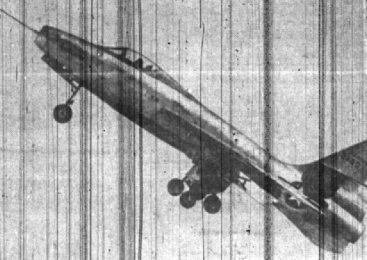

**Residents Oppose Fill Operations At Plum Hollow**  
A petition to the Southfield township board of appeals to allow the Plum Hollow golf club to fill a low swamp area at the rear of the club house with rubbish from the city of Detroit was reviewed by township board members Tuesday night who decided to study the action further before answering the petitioners.

Both the Southfield Citizens League and the Plum Hollow Estates No. 1 Civic association have entered protests to the proposed dump fill because of the nuisances they feel will result from the operation.

Officials from the club explained the dump fill method to board members and stated that the operation has been successful in other areas and no nuisance has been caused.

RESIDENTS OPPOSE the truck traffic, possible breeding place for rodents, litter falling from trucks, insects and the burning of the area.

An official of the Detroit Department of Public Works guessed that it would take over a 1,000,000 square yards of rubbish to bring the level of the low area to the grade of the existing parking lot.

Tentative plans call for a two-year operation which would fill for 250 land packers a day. Five days a week to complete the fill.

Supervisor William Rouser reported that the board will take the matter under advisement and have an answer for the petitioners within 10 days.
