

Soter's 5 Hitter Wins For Cranes In Opening Game

Cranbrook School's Varsity Baseball team won its opening game last season by a score of 4-3. The game was played at Cranbrook's Home Field on Thursday, April 22, in front of a crowd of 200.

The game was won for Cranbrook in the 4th inning by Don Slotkin's home-run to deep center field with Joe Frendberger on base. The walk-up made the score 4 to 1 for the Cranes. Pitcher Bill Soter pitched a Waterford rally in the 5th to clinch the contest for the home team.

Soter began the game by striking out the side in the first inning; however, Waterford got to him in the third, scoring on a walk to Jim Lesar, followed by a long triple by Jim Attard. The game stood at 1 to 0 for the visitors until the home half of the 5th when Cranbrook pushed across 2 runs to take the lead.

The first run was scored as a result of Slotkin's walk, the only one given by Waterford. Pitcher Jack Kratt in the five and two-third innings pitched Soter grounded out and Bob Newey's smash hit to left scored Slotkin. While the run was scoring, Newey continued to assault Waterford by being up on Calvin Cochran's single to right field.

In the next inning Waterford made another run on walks to J. L. Bigelow and Don Kaniko and 2 consecutive passed balls by the catcher George Gray. The first run of the contest was scored by Kratt on a lead's infield hit.

Although Soter allowed 5 hits and 7 walks, he retired 17 Waterford batters on strikes while striking out the side in 4 of the 7 innings.

Cranbrook will face this team again on May 31 at Waterford. Cranbrook's next game will be played this afternoon at Fennell.
