## Central Michigan Alumni Will Gather Wednesday Night at Pontiac Hotel

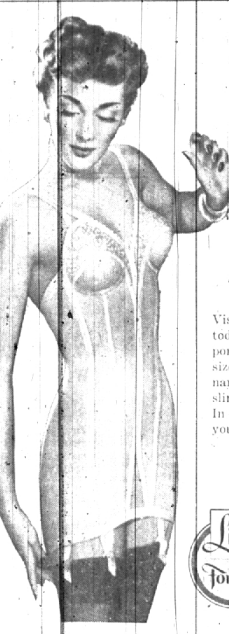

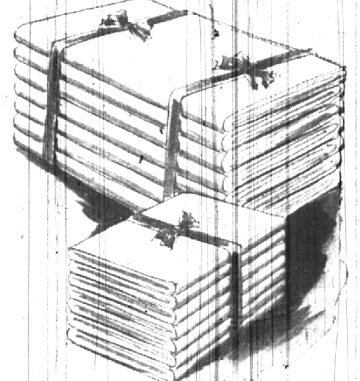

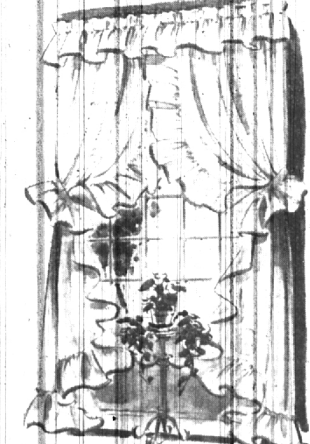
