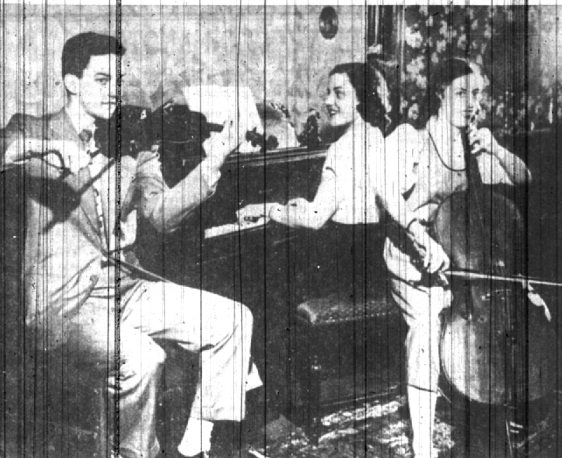


First Methodist Women Planning Luncheon Meets

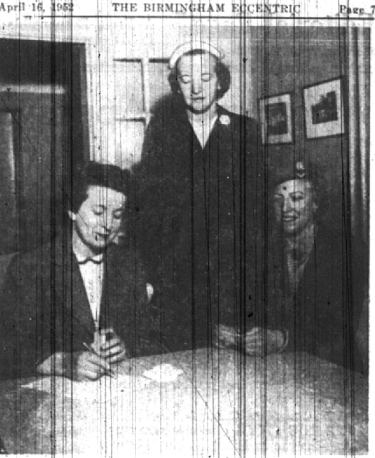
