

### Organize Jr. Achievement Committees

Six committee chairmen to organize and conduct the Junior Achievement movement for Birmingham boys and girls have been announced by Harvey E. Greener, director of Bloomfield Hills, general chairman.

Vice chairmen of the general committee and chairman of the supervision of JA committees are George S. Averill, 609 Riverchase, Richard H. Gardner, 172 Aspen, in general chairman, Merrill D. Hill, Bloomfield Hills, is chairman of the supervisory committee.

Chairman of the business center committee is E. M. Helzer of Detroit, Paul Carter, 385 Ferndale, is chairman of the JA company membership committee. W. A. Murphy, 4519 Sheridan Drive, Royal Oak, is chairman of public relations.

Senior and junior high pupils between the ages of 15 and 21 are invited to learn the facts about American business by actually engaging in business.

The boys and girls are formed into individual companies of 12 to 18 members, and actively go into business, offering a product or service as their stock in trade.

It is planned to establish a Business Center in this area which will be used by several JA companies in carrying out their business ventures. The two centers now in use in Detroit are equipped with a variety of production machines as well as with office equipment and other business facilities.

Under the supervision of a director, several companies in the centers each night to manufacture their products, plan sales campaigns, keep the company books and handle the scores of tasks involved in their business ventures.

AT THE PRESENT TIME there are 221 chartered JA companies with an average attendance of 1,820 boys and girls in operation in Detroit, a total exceeded nationally only by Chicago.

"We believe Junior Achievement can be a great thing for the boys and girls of Birmingham," said Greener. "From the enthusiasm that has been built up as the result of the introductory testing, I have no doubt but what the Birmingham JA program, scheduled to get under way in fall, will have the start of the school year in September will interest our boys and girls and become a community asset."
