

Scouts Russian 'Chess Play'

"What's Happening in World Affairs" was the title selected for an address by Henry C. Wolfe of New York City, when he appeared before the Birmingham branch of the American Association of University Women Wednesday, April 15.

Wolfe, author and journalist and on-the-spot observer of the foreign picture, illustrated his talk with three large maps, but outlined what he believed to be the "best move" type of campaign that the Soviets have planned for the future.

WITH TWO world wars behind him, in little more than one generation, the speaker pointed out the fact that the United States and other western powers would still be faced with difficult economic and social problems even if we should not encounter a conflict to surmount.

The burning up of raw materials and the great loss of manpower as a result of World Wars I and II present great problems themselves. Wolfe stressed the importance of Indo-China and why the Soviets want it. Indo-China is the gateway to Malaya, the raw heart of the world and if Russia gets it, India, Japan and China will be under her control from a strategic standpoint.
