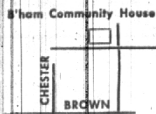

The over-present television set was the topic of discussion Thursday evening, April 16, when members of the Pierce PTA heard Fran Harris, WJZ morning editor. The speaker was introduced by Mrs. R. J. Vinton, retiring mother vice-president.

In outlining television's background, costs, possibilities and risks, Miss Harris stressed that the public has away over programming and that "television is only as good as the people who watch it allow it to be."

Miss Harris pointed out that comments written to the sponsors of a program are taken very seriously. Unfavorable shows often are continued because of a lack of adverse criticism whereas excellent programs are often dropped due to a lack of expressed approval.
