**SPRING FISHING IN  
MICHIGAN**

Michigan anglers are fortunate indeed to have such a wide variety of fishing reported so early in the season. There's scarcely a hole of water from the time ice fishing ceases to the beginning of the winter's awaited melt.  
Actually, at Bethel on Crystal Lake sportsmen may still find sufficient ice for deep water fishing for trout while the mouth of Cold Creek at the east end of the lake is teeming with silver smelt. And the Cold Creek run is usually the earliest in the State.  
Two later thousands upon thousands of dippers cruise along the shores skirting Lake Huron and Lake Michigan, searching for tiny stragons and drainage ditches which usually harbor a good run of smelt. In some areas of the Great Lakes the runs are so heavy that one may merely scoop the waters near the beach and be assured of a good catch. Techniques vary, calling for wire or counting Labe Huron and ranging from 4 feet to 16 feet long.

**Whitney Drain Popular**

State Police have estimated as many as 10,000 dippers in a single night at the famous Whitney Drain just below Trowal when the run is at its peak. Here you'll see waders floating beside wading dippers with short handled nets. When the fish threaten to sink they're tossed, and another dipper takes over the "pat" Splice is at a premium.

A Birmingham resident, Mort Neff, "Michigan Outdoors" television show appears every Thursday at 7:30 p.m. over station WWJ-TV.

During the daylight hours, perch fishing at the Pine River miles east of Standish is lavishing. On a sunny week end in April six or seven thousand Pine River fishermen may be jammed into a few thousand feet of shoreline making an unbroken line of anglers.  
The notorious costuming Saginaw Bay lure many more who believe larger perch are to be found in these waters, and further south at Fort Huron and Algona's smelt dippers with two-man 16-foot nets battle the stiff current in the St. Clair river to come up with as much as a ton of smelt per two-man team per night.

**Sucker and Carp Running**

April fishing in Michigan offers something special and dipping suckers and carp. At Omer on US 23 between Standish and Tawas sucker dippers operate on a commercial basis, using large dip nets with 20-foot leaved handles. And carp runs attract bowfishermen and spearfishing in the hundreds of inland waterways.

**Walleyes Spawning**

At Newago on the Muskegon River and on the Detroit River big spring runs of walleyes or "pickers" offer sport with fish running up to 10 pounds and more. Angling methods are many, ranging from heavily weighted hand lines for trolling to ordinary bass rods with casting lures. All in all spring fishing in Michigan Outdoors is "The Best for Angler."

**Little League  
Tryouts Saturday  
At Two Fields**

Spring tryouts will begin for Little League Saturday morning at both Pierce and St. James fields. League officials have announced.

Opening drills will begin at both fields at 10 a.m. Only five candidates for the eight teams are asked to report for the tryouts and boys playing in the league last year will be notified later when the practice season will start for them.

The league this year has been split into two geographic divisions. Boys living north of a line running west on Lincoln to Woodward, north on Woodward to Maple and west on Maple to the school district limits will be in the National league and will report to Pierce field.

Boys living south of this dividing line will be in the American league and will tryout at St. James field.

QUALIFICATIONS for play are that boys be between the ages of eight and 12 and live within or go to school in the Birmingham school district. Candidates for this year should bring their gloves and application blanks signed by their parents to the fields Saturday. The blanks may be obtained at any school in the district.  
According to Mel Adams, vice-chairman of the league board, the league will lose between 100 and 150 players of the age limit this year.  
An eight-team farm system will

again be organized this year to give more boys the opportunity to play competitive baseball and train them for play with the American and National league teams.  
The tryouts will continue for three weeks until the player auction. The regular season will start Monday, June 1 and will end Thursday Aug. 30.

**MANAGERS** appointed for the National division this year are Lafayette Robinson, Tony Stell, Chris Shearer and Bob Thomson. American league managers will be Bob Dickinson, Don Zilott, Bill Roberts and Paul Jackson.

Additional officers will be appointed later to fill other administrative positions.  
While Little League has been able to raise enough money for uniforms and equipment, officers feel that much of this equipment will have to be replaced by the latter part of the season. Groups wishing to contribute to the Little League treasury are asked to contact Jim O'Connor.
