MacRae, director of the Welfare Council of Metropolitan Chicago, stated that "The social agencies are the recognized expression of our hope for the brotherhood of mankind. We all owe a little more to our community than just paying our taxes. In modern society, the support of social service work is not optional—it is at the core of our commitment to humanity." MacRae, formerly director of the Community Chest of Detroit, was for years a resident of Pleasant Road.
