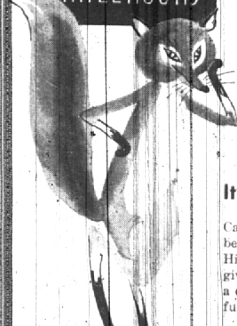

**County Rep. Women Plan May 17 Breakfast**

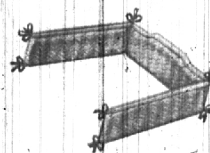
