Pythians Meet in Flint

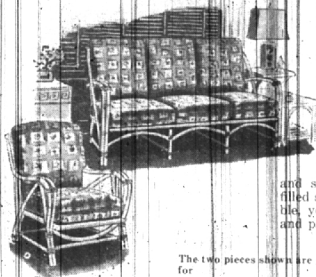
Local members of the Pythian Sisters will journey to Flint May 6'clock Tuesday evening, May 5, 13 for their annual state conven-
