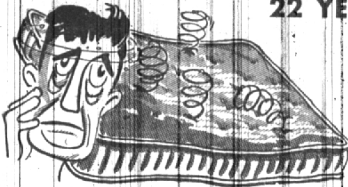
Mr. and Mrs. E. C. (Al) Lewis, of Franklin court, announce the birth of a son, Eric Ward, on April 17.
