

# To Take Part In Michigan Academy Show

Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills artists will take an important part in the coming exhibition which opens on April 17 in Kresge Science Library, Wayne University, Detroit, a part of the 57th annual conference of the Michigan Academy of Science, Arts and Letters.

There are 183 artist members throughout the state, a large part of whom will submit paintings, sculptures, architectural perspectives and other items.

In the Birmingham area, Theodore Ludrowick, head of the design department at Cranbrook and who redesigned the Detroit Art's Market for the "Abstract in Real-

ism" exhibit, did an excellent job, critics, which was highly successful.

FLORENCE EYER of Walled Lake received second prize in the 57th annual exhibition of Paintings of the Circus at Ringling Museum of Art in Sarasota, Fla. All in all the 27 artists listed as members of the Academy in this area have done an outstanding job since the last Academy show in Ann Arbor.

The exhibit of the Fine Arts section is considered important in art circles by reason of the high standards placed upon the member artists who are selected by a board of experienced artists and art

There is no jury, therefore no awards or prizes since all work is done by artists only of the highest caliber, although an award is given annually to one person who has done the most for art during the past year. This may or may not be an artist.

The Michigan Academy is holding its conference from April 16 to 18. All sessions are open to the public. The 28 divisions of the Academy cover a wide scope of subjects from anthropology to zoology.

## World War I Recalled As Pastor, Ex-Soldier Meet at Utica Service

History turned backward briefly on Maundy Thursday for the Rev. David Thorberry, D.D., of 488 Southfield, when he celebrated the Communion service at St. Luke's Episcopal mission in Utica.

It recalled to him a Christmas service in Clary, France, in 1917, when a small group of soldiers converted a cattle barn into a temporary chapel in which to hold worship.

One of the men who helped the young pastor conduct that service was Henry Kirkpatrick, among the first American troops to go overseas.

On Maundy Thursday, under far different circumstances, the

two men met again, Kirkpatrick coming from his home in Washington, Mich., to attend services at St. Luke's.

Following the Utica service, the two men spent some time reliving their former associations, recalling old buddies and marveling at the strange events in man's life.
