

Adams Widening Roll To Be Spread

Birmingham city commissioners have approved the hearing of necessity for the widening and resurfacing of Adams road between Lincoln and a point north of Birmingham, and directed that the assessment roll be spread for a later hearing.

Total of the city assessment roll will be \$122,350 with the Oakland County Road Commission to pay \$51,350 for improvement of the water 20 feet of the roadway and one-half of the cost of drainage structures.

City Holds Off On Property Sale

No immediate action is claimed by city commissioners on the proposed sale of a parcel of property south of the city disposal plant and fronting on Fournier Mile road.

Commissioners have failed to agree on the advisability of selling the 1700-foot by 235-foot piece of land for residential sites and decided to retain the property for the time being.

City Planning Director Robert S. Boatman recommended the property be sold in a report asked by City Manager Donald C. Rebert. Commissioner Ralph Mann urged that the property be held to prevent any further city problems arising in the area.

Commissioner Louise Minor proposed the property be kept for awhile and also advised that if the land was sold, the money could be used for the city's street parking developments.

MINOR ALSO suggests that Springdale Park could be sold for enough money to immediately tackle the city's parking situation.

Commissioner V. B. Watkins believes the property should not be used for a park. He believes that the city could become too full of park grounds and asked that the recreation board and plan board investigate the number of parks the city could service well and hold to these services.

Pembroke School Services Studied

City Manager Donald C. Rebert has been instructed by city commissioners to make a report on the city's ability to serve the new Pembroke school site with sanitary sewer and water.

The school board also has requested the use of Birmingham storm water facilities for the Troy township site north of Darby and west of Eton. City officials believe storm water will have to be handled in the Troy district.
