

Col. Paul Rusch to Speak Again at Christ Church

Col. Paul Rusch, director of KEEP (Kiyosato Educational Project), will address a special dinner meeting at Christ Church Cranbrook on April 13.

Col. Rusch spoke at Christ Church a short time ago, at one of the Sunday services and was invited to appear there again on popular demand.

He went to Japan more than 20 years ago "for a few months" as a professor at St. Paul's university in Tokyo, as a colonel in the Army intelligence in the Pacific and as a visitor to his homeland have on brief and infrequent.

HE IS CURRENTLY touring the United States to bring the message of KEEP to the public.

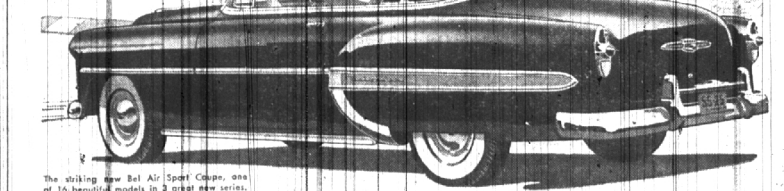
