Efforts still continue by land and air to find Eugene Arthur Parmenter, 53, of 6026 Thurber, Wing Lake Pontiac broker, who has been missing from his summer cottage at Crystal Lake following a note Sunday by his wife of a recent saying that "They will find my body in Lake Michigan... that's where I'll be very sorry for what I'm doing to you but this is the best way out."

PARMENTER, manager of the Pontiac brokerage house of W. H. Provia Co., is claimed to have been \$12,200 worth of securities entrusted to him to get a personal loan at a Pontiac bank...

IN THE LETTER to his wife, mailed last Sunday from Beulah Parmenter, who had flown up to find her husband...

PARMENTER, according to police, became panicky Friday of last week when the Portin Community National Bank called for payment on the \$12,200 personal loan...

MRS. PARMENTER, concerned about the fact that her husband had not come home Friday night, drove up to her Crystal Lake cottage Saturday, where she found his driver's and pilot's license...
