

Schools Prepare To Open Doors For Nearly 7,000

Appointment of 28 new teachers Tuesday night by board of education members will bring the total of new teachers in the Birmingham school district to 63 in September.

There will be 235 teachers on the payroll when school doors open in September to handle what appears to be an enrollment near 7,000.

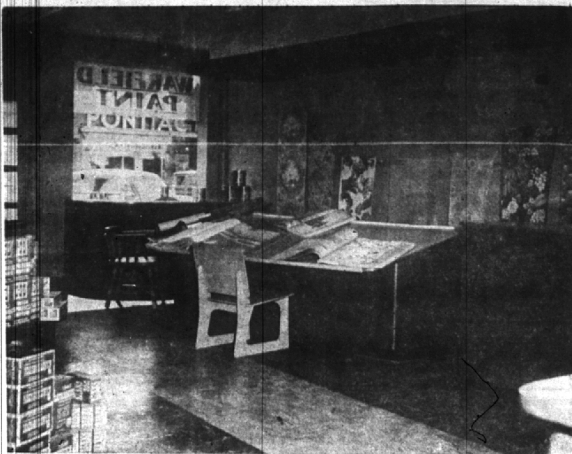
All school principals are holding daily office hours in their schools and ask that new pupils in the district who were not enrolled in the Birmingham public schools

last year to report to the school office and register between the hours of 9 and 11 a.m. and 2 to 4 p.m.

ELEMENTARY students will report to the schools at 9 a.m. Tuesday, Sept. 8 and will be dismissed at noon the first day. Junior and senior high school pupils will report at 8:20 a.m. the first day and will also be dismissed at noon.

The school board has sent out a plea to residents who have rooms or apartments available for incoming teachers to call Gloria McBride at the board of education and list the room they have available.

Over 200 registered at the Oak Park city hall Monday night, according to City Clerk John Hivard, bringing the total registration in that city over the 6,700 mark.

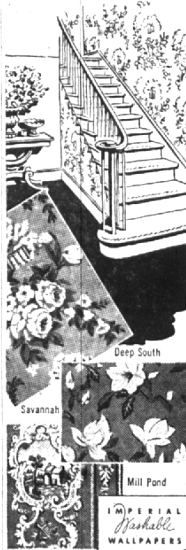
Building Trends Theme Of Architects' Forum
