J., formerly of Birmingham. At the moment off on a fishing trip to Copper Harbor, Lt. Fisher will no doubt contemplate on the resumption of his law practice, either in Birmingham or Detroit.

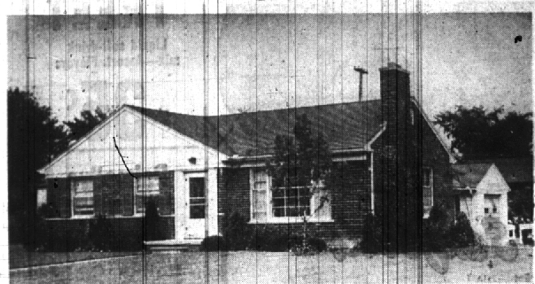

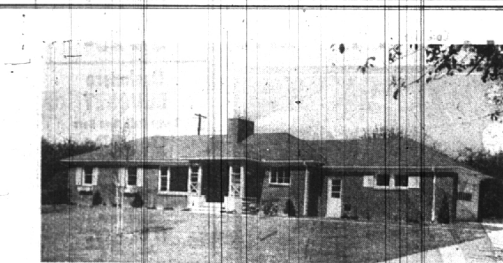
