There is a casual look about the new fur coats and jackets. Backs are either full or belted. Three-quarter length sleeves are seen on some models.

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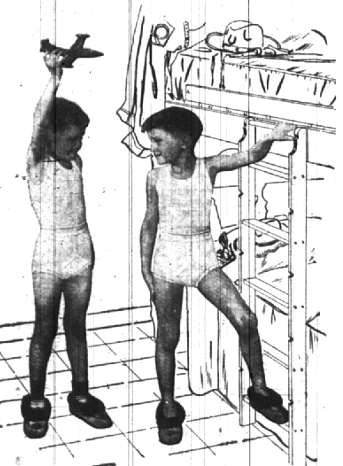
