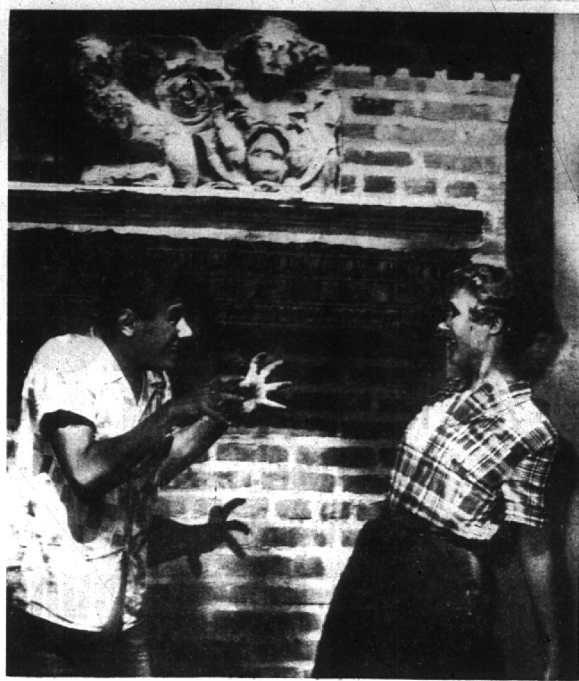

- SMELLERS**
1. Sow FORGET-ME-NOTS now for early bloom in 1954. Makes a beautiful cover in tulip bed.
  2. Divide and move MERTENSIA (Virginia Bluebell) this month.
  3. Cut off and burn dead foliage of BLEEDING HEART.
  4. We have on hand a nice selection of PERENNIAL SEEDS for planting this fall. Come in NOW so that seeds not in the racks can be ORDERED.
  5. Keep your flower beds clean and loose with an ALL-PURPOSE HOE the finest tool in the business.
  6. Cut HOLLYHOCKS to the ground after blooming—burn foliage—spray seedlings with BORDEAUX or SULPHUR.
  7. Continue to DIVIDE and PLANT IRIS.
- EATERS**
1. Tie up CAULIFLOWER HEADS by pulling leaves over top and fastening with string to get proper blanching.
  2. If CABBAGE HEADS begin to crack, BEND them over so as to break the root on one side. This will check the growth.
  3. FIRM the soil around BRUSSELS SPROUTS to get SPROUTS instead of LEAF GROWTH.
  4. Put a large pan of water in the TOMATO patch. Pheasants will not peck the fruit if water is available. (Maybe)
  5. When removing old canes from RASPBERRY BUSHES be careful not to injure the NEW CANES.

**UNINVITED GUESTS**

1. Spray GREEN WORMS on evergreens with DD-DIE or ISOTOX GARDEN SPRAY.
2. Place shingles close to SQUASH VINES as trap for SQUASH BUGS. Look under them in early morn and destroy bugs. (We don't sell shingles.)
3. White dots on ELYONIMOUS vines indicate SCALE. VERY SERIOUS. Spray with NICOTINE SULPHATE or PYRETHRUM.
4. THINK NOW about your fall lawn program—
