

Annual Adventist Assembly Attracts Local Delegates

Beginning today, some 12,000 Seventh-day Adventists are expected to attend the 86th annual Michigan Campmeeting assembly at Grand Lodge, according to Dr. G. E. Hutches, state conference president.

Heading the local delegation will be Elder Wilbur C. Nott, pastor of the Ferndale Seventh-day Adventist church.

Delegates from the Birmingham area include Mr. and Mrs. Fred Bliesath, 652 East Maple, Mr. and Mrs. LaVern Bliesath and family, 2581 Delemere, Mrs. John H. Buckenrough, Sr., 3081 Adams and Mr. and Mrs. George Ring and family, 16252 Kirkshire.

The ten-day meeting will draw one of the largest crowds in the camp's history. Many families will commute, but those coming from more distant points of the state will live in the 450 tents pitched in rows on the shaded grounds, in the 236 permanent cabins, trailers or nearby hotels.

GUEST SPEAKERS from the denomination's world headquarters in Washington, D. C. will be present and will include Elder William H. Branson, president of the general conference of Seventh-Day Adventists.

A feature of the Aug. 8 services will be the "Faith For Today" nationwide television broadcasts, headed by Elder W. A. Pagal.
