

Judge Gaffill Pledges Jail Terms For Holiday Season Drunk Drivers

Judge John J. Gaffill today announced that the Justice Court of Birmingham is cooperating with the State Liquor Control Commission, the State Safety Commission and the Associations of Chiefs of Police and sheriffs to stamp out traffic accidents caused by drunk driving.

This concerted attack against the drunk driver will be conducted during December and early January to emphasize to the motorists of Michigan that drunk driving is disastrous at any time during the year—especially during the holiday season with its many celebrations.

According to Judge Gaffill, any person who gets drunk and drives is entitled to protection against a complete disregard for the lives of other motorists and pedestrians.

"The people of our community are entitled to protection against drunk driving and this court intends to serve the people of this area by giving advance notice to all motorists who may be tempted to drive while drunk that in the event of apprehension they must expect serious consequences," the judge added.

"The Birmingham Justice Court is, therefore, adopting the policy of applying a minimum penalty of a jail term plus a minimum fine fixed by law of \$50, and taking up the driver's license of any motorist found guilty of driving while drunk," the judge stated.

"It is my personal professional belief that the crime of driving while drunk is such an atrocious offense against society that there could be no extenuating circum-

stances sufficiently compelling to exempt any person from not serving time in jail in addition to paying a fine.

"It should be clearly understood that each case will be decided on its own merits and the amount of the penalty adjusted to the circumstances of each individual case," Judge Gaffill continued.

AS A REMINDER to all traffic violators appearing in court that the public and the officials are aroused by the alarming increase in traffic deaths in Michigan and that firm counter measures are being applied to stamp out drunk driving this court is displaying the official poster to be used throughout the state which reads "Drunk Drivers Go To Jail."

Judge Gaffill also urged all motorists to take note of the safety message on the table texts to be displayed in all bars and taverns

which read "If You Are Driving—TAKE IT EASY—Don't Lose Your Driver's License."

This warns of the state law which prescribes an automatic suspension of the driver's license for 90 days of any person found guilty of drunk driving.

WE HEARD IT SAID BY—CHARLES SAVAGE, 607 West "Saturday traffic is really something! I came home to lunch shortly after one o'clock and believe it or not, it took me 10 minutes to drive from the Woodward corner over as far as the Wabeek building on Maple. What with the normal flow of traffic, double parking and people trying to get in and out of parking places, the whole thing was tied up tight."

IN CONCLUSION, the Judge said, "I sincerely hope that all motorists will cooperate on this campaign to save lives and that this
