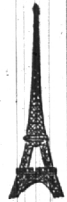

Cranbrook Schools Delegation Attends Chicago Conference

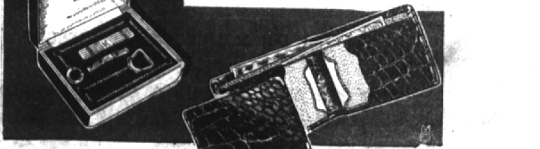
