onstrated demand so there is no gamble involved."

DEVILIN SAID, "This plan is too ambitious for the present or for some years come. If we are talking about shopper parking, it's another matter for the all-day parking clerks—and they won't pay much for parking, if anything."

He said another thing which "disturbed" him was the investment and commitment the city would be required to make in only one quadrant of the business section.

Woodward and Maple definitely divide the business district into four parts, each of which have their own parking needs," he stated. "Even if there were 5,000 spaces in the northwest lot, we still would find people wanting to park elsewhere."

HE SAID in his opinion, if Wabeek-Jacobson charged motorists to park in their present lots on the south side of Willets, "they would park many more cars per day. Even if they charged only five cents an hour, lots of the all-day parkers would disappear and thus there would be more parking space for shoppers."

He admitted merchants would have a problem finding parking space for their employees, but said preferential lots should be reserved for shoppers while employees use less preferential space.

Devilin is convinced that any off-street parking program should contemplate parking in all four business quadrants.

FOLLOWING Devilin's presentation, city commissioners spent several minutes in discussion. Information they had heard and its relation to the five-week-old Wabeek-Jacobson proposal.

Then Commissioner Lance Minor authorized the group with his commission that the discussion be held to have a bearing on a letter which each commissioner had received Friday evening with the Monday agenda.

"Don't you think we should have it read?" he asked Mayor Main.

The two-page letter, plainly labeled "Committee Report", then was read by City Clerk Irene Hanley.

WHEN ASKED by the commission if he had any comments on the subject matter in the letter, Devilin said, "I notice that it suggests the Rouge area immediately across the Rouge ravine from the proposed Willets-Woodward lot) were not trying to block plans for off-street parking."

"The people I represent," explained Gilray, "do not feel the Wabeek-Jacobson proposal is based on sound business economics so that it will pay off the city's investment."

Should the city accept this brand new Wabeek-Jacobson offer, it would require the removal of six existing dwellings.
