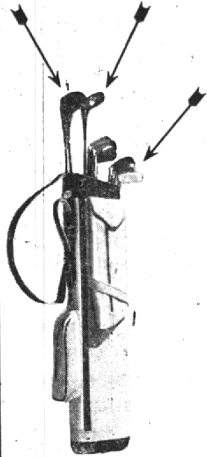

SOUTHEAST OF BIRMINGHAM—Two students from this area are in the news from Ann Arbor this week. Charles Wingert of Elmwood avenue is busy making a reputation for himself as a tenor. Last Sunday he appeared as guest soloist in the First Congregational church at Muskegon. Thursday he sang the solo Bach's "Magnificat" in the Christmas program presentation by the 250-voice University of Michigan choir. He also sang that evening with the University Madrigal group.
