Pimento Sandwich Spread
1 peck red bell peppers
1 pint vinegar
1 pint sugar
4 tablespoons flour (rounded)
1 jar prepared mustard
1 tablespoon salt
Remove the white fibre and the seeds from the peppers. Stir all ingredients together except the mustard. Cook until thick about 15 minutes. Put mustard in jars and cover with paraffin. This will keep several months. When ready to use mix with grated cheese.

Garden Salad Sandwiches
1 green pepper shredded
6 cooked lettuce minced
1 stalk celery minced
1/2 cup mayonnaise
Few drops onion juice
1/2 cup chili sauce
15 slices rye bread buttered
8 lettuce leaves
Combine vegetables, mayonnaise and chili sauce. Spread half of bread with filling and put together with lettuce between. Makes 8 sandwiches.

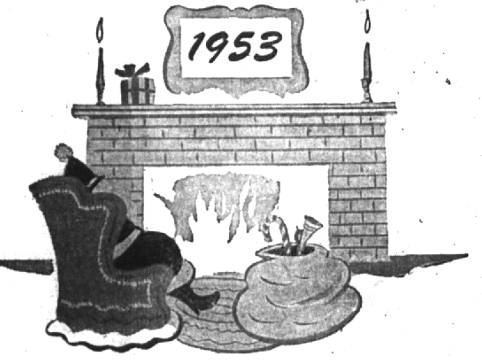
