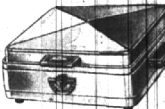

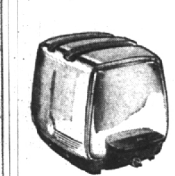

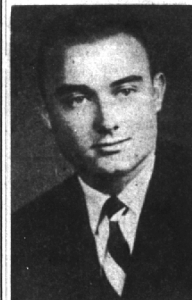

**Safety Effort Aimed Against Drunk Driving**

Opening of the December state-wide traffic safety emphasis program aimed at reducing accidents due to drunk driving is announced by State Police Commissioner Joseph A. Childs. The campaign is sponsored by the State Safety Commission, Michigan Liquor Control Commission and the state associations of chiefs of police, sheriffs, judges and justices.

"Drunk driving is one of our worst traffic accident problems because of the deaths that result and the fact that such accidents are avoidable," Childs said. "According to National Safety Council statistics, among drivers involved in fatal accidents whose condition was reported, 18 out of 100 had been drinking."

"Driving on high speed highways requires every motorist to be on the alert every second. If drunk stimulates the individual to take unusual risks or if it impairs his judgment or physical ability he doesn't stand a chance in modern traffic and, still worse, neither do other motorists or pedestrians in his path."

**THE COMMISSIONER** cautioned motorists who are looking forward to the holiday season with its many festive events.

"The smart ones," he said, "make other transportation arrangements if they are going to drink."

The commissioner expressed appreciation for the cooperation being given the campaign by the liquor control commission and the Michigan Table Top Licensees Congress.

In addition, chiefs of police and sheriffs have called meetings of all bar and tavern owners to enlist their participation and the liquor commission also asked them to attend.

"With all interested groups working together we hope to make the holiday period the safest we have ever had," he stated.

**Columbus Boy Choir To Perform for Detroit Town Hall**

The celebrated Columbus Boy-choir, directed by Herbert Huffman, will give a concert at Detroit Town Hall, Wednesday morning, December 9. Christmas carols will highlight the holiday note of the program, which will be presented at 11 o'clock in Fisher Theatre.

**Troy School Fund Gets Shot In Arm**

The operating fund of Troy school district is solvent again. Supt. of Schools Stewart K. Baker, who last week had asked board approval to seek a loan of \$40,000 to meet current operating expenses, was pleased to find on his desk Monday morning a check for \$70,000.

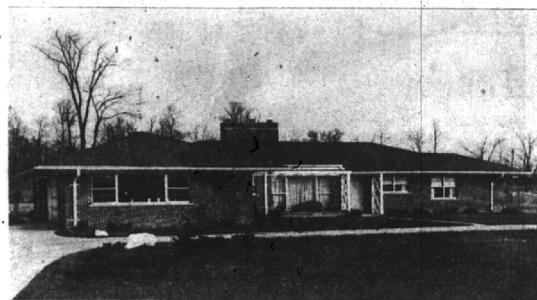
The money was an advance to the school district of state aid money which is generally paid after the first of the year.

"I had applied for the advance in October but with the reports of low levels of money in the state treasury, I didn't plan on getting

all of it," said Baker. Baker now plans to pay off \$30,000 of a \$50,000 loan that he will have left is expected to keep things rolling until tax revenues start coming in in January.
