Recipes

- Sweet Potato Balls**
 6 sweet potatoes
 3 tablespoons melted butter
 Cream
 3 tablespoons brown sugar
 2 eggs
 1/2 cup whole nut meats
 Cook potatoes, peel and mash. Add well beaten egg yolks and enough cream to make whipping easy.
 Add the butter, brown sugar, and a pinch of salt. Beat it thoroughly until mixture is stiffy, then add nutmeats. Fold in fluffy beaten egg whites. Put into buttered baking dish. Sprinkle with nuts and bake 30 minutes in an oven 350 degrees.
- Minted Sweet Potatoes**
 6 medium sweet potatoes
 4 to 5 sprigs of fresh mint
 1/3 cup pineapple juice
 4 tablespoons butter or margarine
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 Cook sweet potatoes in boiling salted water until tender when tested with a fork. While potatoes cook, chop mint in fine pieces and let steep in pineapple juice. Peel and mash potatoes, add butter, pineapple-mint mixture, and salt. Beat thoroughly until very light.
