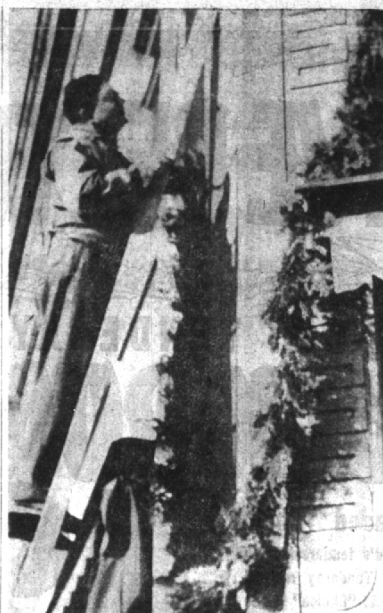
**First Baptist**
