The bride-elect attended Michigan State college for two years and Robert is now a freshman there in the school of veterinary medicine.

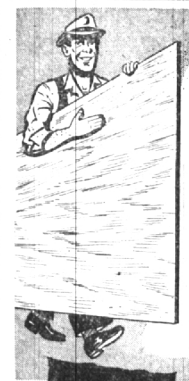
