Suffer Tests Planned to Get Driver Permit

A five-point program to strengthen driver license examining procedures to eliminate incompetents at the wheel was approved at a conference on revision of Michigan rules and regulations for operator licenses held at State Police headquarters in East Lansing.

Although administration of the driver license is shared by the State Police Commissioner and the Secretary of State, representatives of both 23 state departments and associations having an interest in the problem were called in to discuss comments and suggestions on the proposed program.

Their recommendations are: 1. A new and more comprehensive written examination for beginner drivers.

2. More rigid vision tests for all drivers.

3. A TWO-DAY training program for the 1,500 licensed examiners in the state and give written vision thereafter. Those who did not attend the school would be dismissed.

4. No temporary driving permits to be issued to beginners until a check has been made of the file in the secretary of state's office containing the names of persons who have previously been judged by a doctor as incompetent or feeble-minded and who have not been restored to competency by judicial decree.

5. A program to obtain more complete reporting of the foregoing mental cases to the department of state.

Implicit approval was given to the proposal that there be no written examination for license renewal applicants unless an examiner believes it advisable in an individual case. This is the present procedure.

A COMMITTEE of conference members was appointed by State Police Commissioner Childs to study the recommendations and report on so that they can be placed in effect soon.

The conference was financed by Commissioner Childs and Secretary of State Owen Cleary, both of whom spoke to the group. Childs pointed out that the meeting had no connection with reports that legislation to revamp the entire
