Resolution To Sell Two Lots

WHEREAS the School District of the City of Birmingham is the owner of Lots 7 and 8 of the Bloomfield Woods Subdivision (adjacent to the Quanton School site) in the City of Birmingham, Oakland County, Michigan as fully described in the recorded plat thereof and said lots are no longer required and are no longer needed for school purposes and it now satisfactorily appears to the Board of Education of said School District that it will be in the best public interest to sell and convey the said two parcels of land pursuant to Section 15, Chapter 6, Part I of Act 319 of Public Acts of 1927, Michigan (Section 15.195 MSA) as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that said two parcels of land be sold and offered by advertising the same once in the Birmingham Eccentric, a newspaper printed and circulated in the County of Oakland, requesting sealed, cash bids on each parcel to be filed by the bidders with the Secretary of the Board of Education not later than the 20th day of January, 1953, to be thereafter opened by the Board of Education at its then or next regular or special meeting and that the Board of Education retain the right to reject any or all bids.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon the Board of Education's determination of the highest acceptable bidder or bidders and upon immediate payment therefor in cash, the sale or sales shall be consummated by instruments (quit claim deeds) passing title to the said parcels of land, together with title insurance subject to restrictions and the standard exceptions, or with abstracts at the option of the Board of Education; and that the President and the Secretary be and they are hereby authorized, directed and empowered to then execute, acknowledge and deliver such deed or deeds in the name of the School District of the City of Birmingham to such purchaser or purchasers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be published pursuant to the foregoing provisions and that such publication shall constitute the public advertising of said parcels for sale.

An \$18,716 special assessment roll has been confirmed by the Birmingham city commission for the paving of portions of three streets in the Sheffield Estates area.

Put in last year, the project consisted of 8 inches of pavement, plus curbs, on Sheffield from Melton to Cheltenham, Cheltenham from Sheffield to Dunstable, and Dunstable from Cheltenham to Melton.



MRS. DEHULL N. TRAVIS Detroit Society Honors Localite For Achievements

The gallery of "Women of Achievement" of the Detroit Historical Society includes the portrait of Mrs. DeHull N. Travis, 1027 Forest avenue.

The gallery, assembled originally for the 25th anniversary of Detroit's founding, will continue at the Detroit Historical Museum through February.

Included are Detroit area women who have contributed notably to the general cultural life of the city in artistic, literary, social, political and allied activities.

MRS. TRAVIS, the former Katherine Crowley, is director of public relations for the Crowley-Miller Company. She is active in radio, and has written a number of one-act plays, several of which have been awarded various prizes.

Mrs. Travis is a member of the Vassar club, Theatre Arts, the Michigan Society of Women Writers, the Woman's City Club, the advisory board of the Women's Association of the Detroit-Society of America, and the public relations committee of the Michigan Federation of Women's Clubs.

IN CONJUNCTION with this exhibit, the Detroit Historical Society, in cooperation with the Board of Education, has planned a series of counseling for 11th grade students.

Mrs. Travis has been appointed chairman of the counseling committee which will represent women in almost every field of endeavor.
