

Series of Scouting Courses Scheduled for SOC Leaders

Girl Scout Adults in Southern Oakland County will be offered a variety of training courses in the next few months to come.

These courses are designed to equip volunteers to carry out the jobs which make possible a meaningful Girl Scout program for over 6,000 girls in the area.

Four sessions in teen age leadership are being offered at the Girl Scout office, 500 South Washington Building, Royal Oak, with this evening's meeting the second in the series. Others will follow at 7:30 p.m. January 22 and 29.

Leaders of Senior troops will find this course offers many specific program possibilities for their teen-age girls.

AN ORIENTATION course is scheduled for Tuesday, January 27, in the Huntington Woods Lutheran Church, with instruction beginning at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.

This course is for all Girl Scout adults who are new to Scouting;

leaders, troop committees, board members, standing committee members, district executive members and neighborhood chairmen.

It is designed as an introduction to the basic fundamentals of Girl Scout program. No registration is necessary.

PROGRAM INSTITUTES will be held at the Berkley High School gym, 2325 Catalpa drive. All classes, for which no registration is required, begin at 7:30 p.m. and continue until 10.

The program for Monday, January 19, deals with arts and crafts in nature. Folk dancing and singing games will be the subject of the January 26 session, and the February 2 topic is yet to be announced.

Basic leadership courses for Brownies and Intermediates will begin in February. Registration may be made through the neighborhood chairman.
