### Soldier-Editor Rites Tuesday Afternoon

Col. Henry H. Burdick, 74, of 1015 N. Woodward, real estate editor of the Detroit Free Press, died Sunday morning at Harper hospital, Detroit, after a long illness.

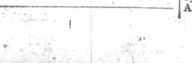
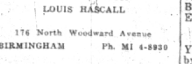
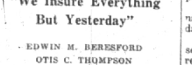
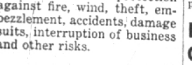
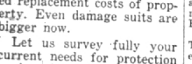
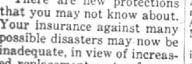
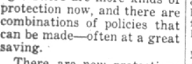
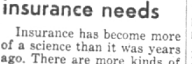
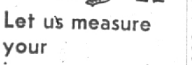
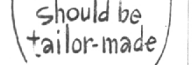
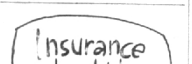
Born in Syracuse, N. Y., on Nov. 12, 1878, Col. Burdick had been a resident of Birmingham since 1923. He joined the real estate division of the Free Press in 1938 and because of his journalistic background was considered a national authority in this field of newspaper work.

Prior to starting this association he was with R. L. Polk and company, in charge of public relations and statistics.

His journalistic career started with service on two Syracuse papers, the Courier and Post, after leaving Syracuse university in his sophomore year.

HE INTERRUPTED his career to serve in the Spanish-American war and after being discharged entered Columbia university where he became editor of the Spectator.

After his graduation in 1900 he joined the advertising firm of Clifford and Lawton. He had been associated with the New York Evening Sun, F. W. Dodge company, publishers of Dodge Building Reports, Architectural Record and Sweet's catalogue.

He was treasurer and managing director of the S. E. Hendricks Co., Ind., and the Kelly Publishing company in New York.

IN ADDITION, he was past president of the Association of Real Estate Editors and held important posts with the Real Estate and Builders Guide of New York, Home Beautiful, Atlantic Monthly, Mothers Magazine and May Mansion Fashion Quarterly.

World War I added another break to his newspaper career. He was commissioned a captain and soon after won a promotion to the rank of major. While leading AEF during three critical phases of the Argonne defensive, he was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal.

He was later named colonel in the organized reserves and given command of the 310th Infantry Regiment, 78th Division. In 1931 he was called to Washington to aid in the preparation of Selective Service regulations.

The National Association of Real Estate board honored his work with a citation in 1943 and he was later awarded second prize for the best real estate section in circulation of over 500,000 population, in national competition.

COL. BURDICK was a past commander of the New York F.W.P. post, a member of Delta Kappa Epsilon, and past commander of Post 125, N. Y. American Legion. His survivors are his widow, Lucille, a son, George L. Burdick, of New York, four grandchildren and three brothers. One grandson, George H. L. Burdick, now stationed in Germany with the US Army, prepares a column for The Eccentric on the service overseas.

Services were Tuesday at Bell Chapel, William R. Hamilton funeral home, with cremation at White Chapel cemetery.

MRS. ALICE ROBNSON CROOKS, 77, of 536 Vinewood, died Jan. 17 at Bloomfield hospital after a long illness.

Born in Pontiac on Sept. 29, 1875, she was married there to George Crooks in 1893. The family came to Birmingham to live in 1918.

Memorial services were held Tuesday afternoon from Bell Chapel of the William H. Hamilton company at Mt. Carmel.

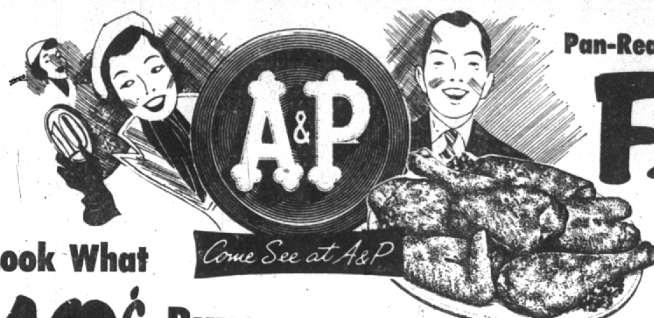
